The T.I.C.K. Board provides the Knowledge, Issues, Decisions and Supports (K.I.D.S.) Program for all Grade 6 students in the City of Brantford. The program introduces information and strategies for making positive and healthy lifestyle choices. We would like to provide secondary school students an opportunity to revisit that critical messaging.

The purpose of the Student Leadership Granting Program is to encourage students to become actively involved in identifying current challenges for themselves and their peers and seeking positive strategies or experiences to respond to those challenges. We believe that student leaders are in a unique situation where they can create opportunities and messaging that is meaningful and relevant to their contemporaries.

Successful grant applications will address at least one of the areas of focus in the K.I.D.S. program

- Mental Health
- Healthy Relationships
- Online and Social Media Awareness
- Youth and the Law
- Substance Awareness

This program is open to students from Grade 9 to Grade 12 in all secondary schools in the City of Brantford. Grant values, to a maximum of \$500, will be awarded depending on the nature and magnitude of the proposed project. A draft budget of the approximate costs that may be incurred through the project must be included.

Grants may be awarded on an individual or group basis. While it is critical that the projects are student led, each application must have a staff mentor acting as an advisor.

How to Apply

- Create your project plan to promote positive choices in your school related to one or more of the five K.I.D.S. areas of focus
- Complete the application form provided and submit it for review by your staff mentor and school administrator
- Send the signed application to the T.I.C.K. Board, drop the application off to T.I.C.K. Brantford Inc. at the Brantford Police Service (attn. Sue Gemmell) or submit your application electronically to info@tickbrantford.ca prior to the deadline.

Please note that successful applicants will be required to present a report to T.I.C.K. Inc. at the conclusion of the project, highlighting the success of the project and the impact it had on their school.
